Application Procedure

- Freshmen applicants must submit an application and essay, academic transcript(s), and counselor and teacher recommendations. Submission of standardized tests (SAT and ACT) is optional. However, those who choose not to submit test results are required to come for an on-campus interview.
- Transfer students should contact the Admission Office for a transfer application.
- Interviews and tours are strongly recommended, although not required.
