Provost's Announcements

Five new faculty have been appointed for the 2007-2008 academic year.

Christopher Catone, Assistant Professor of Mathematics.

Dr. Catone obtained his doctorate in Mathematics from the University of Colorado in 2006. He comes to Albright from the University of Hawaii at Manoa where he is a Visiting Assistant Professor. Prior to that, Dr. Catone served as a Graduate Instructor and a Teaching Assistant at the University of Colorado, and as a member of the mathematics faculty at St. Paul VI High School.

Elizabeth A. Freund, Assistant Professor of Political Science.

Ms. Freund's doctorate is expected in May of 2007 from the University of Maryland. She has served as an instructor at the U.S. Naval Academy since the fall of 2005. Prior to that, she was a lecturer at the University of Maryland.

George E. Smith, Assistant Professor of Economics and Business.

Dr. Smith obtained his doctorate in Public Administration from the Nelson A. Rockefeller College of Public Affairs and Policy. He comes to Albright from the College of Oneonta, State University of New York, Division of Economics where he has served as an Assistant Professor of Management and Business since 2002. Prior to that, he was employed as a Senior Computer Programmer/Analyst, Senior Administrative Analyst, and New York State Public Management Intern (PMI) at the New York Department of Civil Service, Information Resource Management-Systems Design and Development.

Paula E. Trimpey, Assistant Professor of Theater and Fashion.

Ms. Trimpey holds a Master of Fine Arts in Theatre/Costume Design from Wayne State University. She has been employed as a Costume Designer/Coordinator and a Cutter/Draper for the Utah Shakespearean Festival for many summers. Additionally, she has worked as a Cutter/Draper and Project Leader for Troika Entertainment; Visiting Assistant Professor of Costume Design for SUNY Fredonia State University; Assistant Professor of Theatre at Huntington College; Assistant Professor of Theatre/Costume at Dixie College; Costume Shop Manager at Pamona College; and Graduate Assistant at Wayne State University in addition to numerous summer fashion projects she has undertaken.

Jeffrey P. Wolbach, Assistant Professor of Chemistry and Biochemistry.

Dr. Wolbach received his doctorate in Chemical Engineering from the University of Delaware. He has been a Visiting Research Scientist at Juniata College since 2004. Prior to that, he worked as an Application Scientist at Tripos, Inc.

Due to a family relocation, **Stacie Eisenhofer**, Director of the Albright Learning Center, will be stepping down as Director, effective April 27, 2007. A search committee reviewed internal applications for the position. I am delighted to announce that Jean Seidel, current Kindergarten teacher who has worked at the Center for many years, including as former director, has accepted the position, effective May 1, 2007. Jean will do double-duty, continuing her position as Kindergarten teacher and serving as director for the remainder of the school year.

Per faculty consensus in the February faculty meeting, all course evaluations must be completed by **Friday, May 4, 2007** (the next to last week of classes). After collecting the evaluations in a single envelope, students should turn in the evaluations to the computer center (Nancy Orlando) so that the forms can be immediately scanned. Dr. Chris Hackler to Visit Albright College

From Monday, April 23 to Friday, April 27, Albright will be hosting Dr. Chris Hackler, a visiting Woodrow Wilson Scholar. The Director of Medical Humanities at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, Dr. Hackler is a philosopher who teaches in a medical school. The division he directs offers courses and produces scholarship in the history of medicine, literature and medicine, law and medicine, and medical anthropology. Dr. Hackler has published widely on topics in his own field of medical ethics, including advance medical directives and end-of-life decisions, health care reform, rationing of health care, and genetic engineering. He has been the recipient of Fulbright, National Defense, and National Endowment for the Humanities awards, has served as Chair of the Association of Faculty in the Medical Humanities, and has received the Distinguished Service Award from the Society for Health and Human Values. He was recently named Inaugural Professor in the Clinton School of Public Service.

On Wednesday, April 25, Dr. Chris Hackler will offer a lecture entitled “Futility and Hope: Science or Politics at the End of Life” in Klein Lecture Hall at 7:00 PM. He will address the question of medical ethics as they relate to end of life issues. This is an extremely important issue in the world today, as the Terri Schiavo case of 2005 demonstrated. The lecture, an Experience event, is open to all students, faculty, and members of the Albright community as well as members of the general public.

In addition to the lecture on the 25th, Dr. Hackler will be speaking to a number of classes on a variety of topics, and will be participating in other activities. We are privileged to have Dr. Hackler with us and hope that Albright can have the honor of hosting other Woodrow Wilson Scholars in years to come.

Interlibrary Loan Materials



ILLiad, the library's new procedure for requesting Interlibrary Loan materials (ILL) is here. ILLiad is a faster, more efficient way for you and your students to obtain materials that we do not own.

The major changes are:

- When you use ILLiad for the first time, you will be asked to create an account that uses your current working email address.
- You will use this new account whenever you request an item through interlibrary loan or want to check the status of any request.
- You will be able to automatically create an interlibrary loan request in most of the journal databases at Albright by selecting the "Request via ILLiad" link in the database. This means no more paper request forms or cutting and pasting text into online forms.
- ILLiad makes heavy use of email. Many items will be delivered electronically and stored on a secure server for you to access, so you need to check your emails for notification of delivery of materials.
- To view or print the items available electronically, you will need a computer with Adobe's Acrobat Reader loaded. This software is available free at <http://www.adobe.com/products/acrobat/readstep2.html> and is loaded on all lab and library computers.

Guideline Dates for Tenure/Promotion Decisions, 2-year, 4-year reviews

May 1 – May 11, 2007

Letter sent by the Chief Academic Officer to all Faculty eligible for tenure and/or promotion decisions, and 2-year, 4-year, and other reviews in the following academic year. Letter outlines information to be submitted and the date files are to be completed (copies of such letter available in Academic Affairs Office).

No Later than June 15, 2007

Untenured Faculty eligible for an early tenure decision by virtue of credit awarded by Albright College for prior college or university teaching service and Faculty eligible for promotion must notify the Chief Academic Officer, in writing, of their request for tenure and/or promotion decision in the following academic year.

Eligible Faculty candidates reply to the Chief Academic Officer in writing with recommendations for peer reviewers.

Eligible Faculty candidates must present scholarly and/or creative works completed on or before the third Friday in June to the Chief Academic Officer and provide a list of external reviewers of those works to the Chief

Academic Officer. Department chairperson of candidate must also submit name of external reviewer to Chief Academic Officer.

From June 15 – August 10, 2007

Chief Academic Officer solicits and collects information from alumni and external sources.

Peer reviewers are selected by the ACRT and invited to participate in the process by the Chief Academic Officer. The Chief Academic Officer notifies the candidates of the selected peer reviewers. Candidates send fall syllabi to peer reviewers.

No Later Than October 12, 2007

Completed files are due in the office of the Chief Academic Officer for those under consideration for tenure and promotion. Department chairs' letters of evaluation, peer reviews, and external evaluations

are due.

Beyond this date no additional information may be added to the candidate's Rank and Tenure File without the knowledge of the candidate and the department chair.

From October 12 – November 16, 2007

ACRT considers recommendations and all materials in the candidate's file.

No Later Than December 14, 2007

Recommendations of ACRT and Chief Academic Officer are sent to the President,

No Later Than January 1, 2008

President determines her/his recommendation and communicates it to the candidate and the Chief Academic Officer. The President shall set forth both his or her written recommendation and the grounds thereof and transmit this written statement to the candidate, the ACRT and the Chief Academic Officer.

January 15, 2008

A candidate for tenure and/or promotion may file a statement with the Faculty Appeals Committee appealing an adverse recommendation of the President.

January 20, 2008

Submission to the Academic Affairs Committee of the Board of Trustees the President's positive recommendations for tenure and promotion. Candidates will be notified in writing of Trustees' decisions one week following the winter full-Board meeting. The January deadline for Trustees' consideration does not apply to a candidate who has appealed, by the aforesaid deadline date, an adverse recommendation made by the President. There is no appeal of an adverse decision by the Board of Trustees.

March 3, 2008

Completed files are due for those undergoing 2-year, 4-year, and other reviews. Department chairperson's letters and peer reviews are due.

May 9, 2008

ACRT sends letter to candidates and their department chairs undergoing 2-year, 4-year and other reviews apprising them of their conclusions regarding their progress toward tenure and promotion.

May 9, 2008

ACRT sends letter to candidates undergoing 2-year, 4-year and other reviews apprising them of their conclusions regarding their progress toward tenure and promotion.

Spring Board Meeting

Trustees consideration and decision for tenure and promotion candidates who had, in a timely fashion, appealed an adverse recommendation by the President to the Faculty Appeals Committee.

Fulbright Scholar Program 2008-2009 U.S. Faculty and Professionals

The Fulbright Scholar Program is offering lecturing and research awards in approximately 150 countries for the 2008-2009 academic year. The competition opens March 1.

Opportunities are available not only for college and university faculty and administrators but also for professionals from business and government, as well as artists, journalists, scientists, lawyers, independent scholars and many others. There are awards in 45 different fields or disciplines, and a varies of sub disciplines are interdisciplinary fields.

Traditional Fulbright Scholar awards are available form two months to an academic year or longer. A short-term grants program – the Fulbright Senior Specialists Program – offers two- to six-week grants in a variety of disciplines and fields.

While foreign language skills are needed in some countries, most Fulbright Scholar lecturing assignments are in English. Some 80 percent of the awards include a lecturing component.

Application deadlines for 2008-2009 awards are:

- **May 1, 2007** for Fulbright Distinguished Chair awards in Europe, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Israel and Russia.
- **August 1, 2007** for Fulbright traditional lecturing and research grants worldwide.
- **November 1, 2007** for the summer German Studies Seminar and for spring/summer seminars in Korea and Japan for academic an international education administrators
- **February 1, 2008** for the U.S.-Germany International Education Administrators Program.
- **Rolling Deadline** for the Fulbright Senior Specialists Program.
