- 2) I would like to remind faculty of the new policy regarding educational trips. Below are excerpts regarding the expectations for faculty, as outlined in the policy (full text available at <http://www.albright.edu/catalog/academicpolicies.html>).
 - a) Plan weekend trips. In cases where this is not possible, permission from the Academic Dean is required. If permission is granted, then faculty member is limited to one weekday field trip per semester for all her/his classes. Additional weekend trips are still permitted.
 - b) Submit Notification to Dean. The faculty member is to submit a field trip notification to the Dean by completing the relevant forms, which can be found at http://www.albright.edu/academics/AA/acad_forms.html. The notification should be presented to the dean's office three weeks before the trip.
 - c) Include on Course Syllabus. The field trip description must be included on the course syllabus including date, required fees, and an alternative assignment if other commitments make attendance on the field trip impossible for the student.
 - d) Notify the Faculty. No later than two weeks prior to the trip an email is to be sent to faculty@alb.edu that describes the academic importance of the field trip, the date and time of the trip, the names of the students participating, and a request that the students be excused from courses during the specified date and times.
- 3) Faculty Hires – Currently, we are conducting the following faculty searches for the 2007-2008 academic year. All of these hires are tenure-track replacements at the assistant level, with the
